## WINES & SPIRITS RULES

1. Only one entry allowed in each class.
2. Class 205 to be exhibited in a sparkling wine bottle, closed with a wire cage, to be opened by the judge. Classes 206 & 207 to be exhibited in colourless bottles. All other classes to use 26oz colourless wine bottles i.e. Sauterne type.
3. Use white plastic topped cork stoppers with an air space of between ½" & ¾" from the top of the wine to the bottom of the cork.
4. Entry ID Label to be fixed 1" from the base and midway between the seams.
5. Where the definition is 'country' these shall be of natural ingredients only. 'Kits' shall be from concentrated kits only.
6. A 'Novice' shall be a person who has not previously gained any prize for a wine entry in any Cherry Burton Village Show.
7. All wine to be of natural fermentation with no fortification, adulteration or colourant, other than classes 206 & 207.
8. Beers and Lagers to be exhibited in one pint beer bottles (clear or coloured). Air space should be ½" to 1" and exhibitors must ensure bottle pressure is not excessive. Use crown cork closures, gold coloured, or screw stoppers.

**155. Bake a Gingerbread Family of 4**

(use recipe below)

INGREDIENTS:

340g (12oz) plain flour  
 115g (4oz) butter  
 1 beaten egg  
 175g (6oz) soft brown sugar  
 2 teaspoons ground ginger  
 1 teaspoon of bicarbonate of soda  
 4 tablespoons golden syrup  
 Icing & currants for decoration

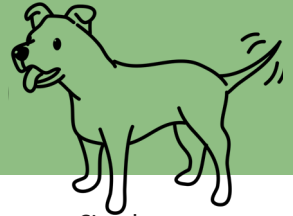
METHOD:

Oven temp: 190°C / 375°F / Gas 5  
 Grease baking trays. Melt butter, sugar and syrup together. Add dry ingredients and then beaten egg. Mix and knead into a ball. Chill dough for 30 mins, roll until 5 mm thick. Cut out shapes and place on baking tray. Use currants to make eyes, buttons, etc. Bake for 10-15 mins until brown. Leave to cool before finishing decoration with icing.

## GENERAL RULES

1. Prize winners in all classes will receive certificates. All Trophies will be engraved and held by the winner for one year.
2. All entries to be submitted as shown on the Entry Form.
3. Children's Classes are free to enter. Adult Classes are 50p per entry.
4. Last date for all Entry Forms is midnight on Sunday 13th July 2025.
5. No exhibitor may make more than one entry in any Class.
6. Entries must not have been previously exhibited. (Pets excluded).
7. All entries must be made by the entrant - adult intervention in any children's classes will be penalised.
8. Entries showing a name will be disqualified.
9. Short stories to be submitted with your Entry Form by midnight on Sunday 13th July 2025.
10. Entry ID Labels for your exhibits will be hand delivered in the week before the show.
11. Paper plates will be available for use in the exhibit rooms, if wanted.
12. All exhibits must be staged between 8.00am - 9.45am at the School on show day. Late entries will not be permitted and will be disqualified.
13. Exhibit rooms close at 9.45am prompt, ready for judging to commence. Only Judges and Officials will then be admitted.
14. Your Entry ID Label must be securely fixed to your entry. Any entry without a visible Entry ID Label will not be judged.
15. The exhibit rooms will open for public viewing at 2pm on show day.
16. All exhibits must remain on display until 4.30pm and be collected by 6pm, after which the organisers will not be responsible for any exhibits or articles.
17. The organisers will not be responsible for any injury to any person/s or animal during the day of the show.
18. Any person exhibiting anything belonging to another or exercising any artifice to deceive the Judges, or otherwise attempting to gain prizes by unfair means, shall forfeit all claims to prizes. The organisers reserve the right to refuse future entries from any such exhibitor.
19. The organisers reserve the right to cancel any class or event at its discretion.
20. The organisers shall have the power to inspect any exhibitor's garden or allotment at any time.
21. Anyone making an objection to an exhibit must do so on the day to the organisers. Complaints submitted later than one hour after the opening of the show will not be entertained. The decision of the referees appointed by the organisers shall be final.
22. Every care will be taken of exhibits, but the organisers will not be responsible for any loss or damage.
23. The organisers may reduce, withhold, or increase prizes where deemed necessary.
24. The organisers reserve the right to reject any exhibit or refuse any entry.
25. The organisers decision on any dispute shall be final.
26. No frozen garden produce may be entered.
27. Any queries in respect of the various classes, on the day of the show, should be directed in the first instance to the Steward in charge of the Class Section.
